Main themes	Students will be taught the vocabulary and techniques of Musicology. They will learn how to carry out heurist research and draw up a bibliography for a given subject. They will be introduced to methodologies for studyir musicological documents and musical works. They will also study the major stages in the development Musicology and current musicological issues, a background which should enable them to take a critical view their own research.				
Aims	This course introduces students to all aspects of musicology research, including terminology, methods and heuristic principles, bibliographic references, describing and analyzing musicological documents, writing, illustrating and presenting a piece of scientific musicological research. This introduction is contextualised within the framework of the evolution of musicology from the past to the present day.
