Main themes	The course will address issues related to belief, in its epistemological, religious, but also specifically Christian aspects. On the first aspect, the course will introduce to the epistemology of religious beliefs. On the second, it will present the problem of the relations between faith and religion. On the third, it will address the notions of lumen fidei, of theological virtue, and of dogma.
