Content	<p>It will study how a particular narrative structure (voice, focalization, etc.), is particularly suited to tell the revelation of a secret, which always involves a number of constraints to the narrative and questions to the reader: who knows the secret, and do not know ?, what is the secret (adultery, mourning, etc.) ?, what kind of relationship is established between the protagonists and the reader given the existence of this shared secret (or not)? , what is the effect of the discovery of this secret? with what effect reading, etc.?</p>
