Content	The Specialised Translation in European Affairs course is devoted to the translation from German into French of texts focusing on EU topics written by experts. In the introductory section of the course, the main tools for the translation of EU documents (such as EUR-Lex, IATE or the Interinstitutional Style Guide) will be presented so that the students can use them in the translation exercises. The themes explored will range from the European construction, the workings of the Union institutions, the Committee on the Affairs of the European Union (German Bundestag) to EU policies. Where appropriate, texts will be translated with the aid of computer-assisted translation
