Main themes	The student is invited to choose a subject related to one of the courses of his program he previously studied. The master in English will bring the help necessary to manage the linguistic aspects. The oral presentation is public and strictly in English (texts, figures and comments) as well as the answers to the questions. The time is strictly limited to a total of 20 minutes.
Aims	<p>The aim of this activity is to familiarize the student with the requirements of the oral presentation in English of a scientific subject.
