Written test 25% (listening and reading 5%, grammar 5%, vocabulary 10% and writing 5%) and oral examen (25%). • the mark for the continuous assessment will not be considered in the september session. Septemer examen: written examen (listening and reading 10%, grammar 10%, vocabulary 20% and writing 10%) and oral examen (50%). <p>These exam and teachingmodalities could be transposed to online teaching and learning according to the evolution of the health situation.</p>

Content	<p>The activities are based on authentic documents (reading and listening comprehension). Basic vocabulary and structures are trained, reinforced and expanded via written and oral exercises (role-plays, interviews, conversations in small groups of 2 or 4,).</p>
