Teaching methods	Due to the COVID-19 crisis, the information in this section is particularly likely to change. Vol.2 of the course (22h30) will be organized partly with the whole group and partly in sub-groups (to be defined according to the number of participants). Those sessions will be taught face-to-face (or via TEAMS if necessary - for example in the event of a health crisis such as COVID). Part of the vol.2 hours will be devoted to the exercises to be completed online.			
Content	Academic English is a specific genre with specific textual and linguistic features. In this course, you will learn to use the linguistic features and rhetorical functions typical of academic English. We will also show you various reference tools to help you improve your academic skills. The aim is for you to learn how to write an academic paper and give an academic presentation. Please note that this is not a 'general English' conversation class.
