Prerequisites	<i>The prerequisite(s) for this Teaching Unit (Unité d'enseignement – UE) for the programmes/courses that offer this Teaching Unit are specified at the end of this sheet.</i>
Main themes	In-depth study of classical Latin Grammar. This course deals with the following themes: 1. Morphology (advanced level); 2. The fundamental structures of Latin syntax (description of syntactic functions assumed by the Latin noun; study of the semantics and use of cases); 3. The use of tenses and moods, the function and uses of pronouns; 4. Personal analysis and translation of a Latin prose text (cursory reading). The exercises are devoted to syntax, prose composition and translation from Latin. There are also special exercises intended to morphological and lexical training.
Aims	1 By the end of this course the student will have a thorough mastering of the fundamental rules of the nominal syntax of classical Latin, and will have improved his knowledge of morphology.
