Aims	1 At the end of the course the student will be able to analyse grammatically, to translate and comment upon texts of average difficulty. Written exam in June on the texts seen during the Q2 course (40%). The global note is an average from the 2 partial notes. For the 2d session, there is an oral exam on the texts of the whole year.

Content	The authors chosen for the course in 2016-2017 are Livius (The end of Servius Tullius) and Tacitus (The tragedy of Messalina).
