Place of the course	Louvain-la-Neuve
Main themes	The course includes the following topics:  1. Introduction to codicology; 2. Handwritten copy of ancient Greek texts and textual transmission issues; 3. Ancient Greek writings; 4. Practical training in reading ancient Greek manuscripts (reading exercices); 5. Theoretical and practical training in editing ancient Greek texts.
Aims	At the end of this course, the student will be able:  • to decipher a ancient Greek manuscript, or to find the necessary assistance to read it; • to locate a written text within the history of ancient Greek writings; • to read, analyse and use an edition (introduction and critical apparatus); • to collate various major manuscripts of a given text and to prepare a provisional edition; • to use bibliographical and working tools. Evaluation methods	Due to the COVID-19 crisis, the information in this section is particularly likely to change. Part of the exam may be replaced by a personal work, according to specific modalities to be decided with the students.

Content	The course is basically constant from year to year (main scriptures, reading exercices, etc.), but it may be more specifically devoted to a particular category of texts or to a particular type of writing.
