Place of the course	Louvain-la-Neuve						
Main themes	In-depth study of the Ancient Near East and of pharaonic Egypt. Alternating with LGLOR2511, this course deals with the following themes, on the base of textual, archaeolo and iconographical sources: 1. Themes relating to the religion of the Ancient Near East (gods and cults); 2. Themes relating to the literature of ancient Egypt.						
Aims	At the end of this course, the student will be familiar with a rigorous scientific approach to specific questions on the cultural history of these civilisations (literature and religion). Evaluation methods	Due to the COVID-19 crisis, the information in this section is particularly likely to change. An oral exam, on the basis of written preparation. The student will be questioned by both teachers. The mark for the part "Ancient Near East" and the mark for the part "Egypt" are each 50% of the final mark.						
Teaching methods	Due to the COVID-19 crisis, the information in this section is particularly likely to change. 1. Religion of the Ancient Near East (Jan Tavernier): The course will be given using abundantly illustrated ppt including maps, texts and pictures. 2. Literature of Ancient Egypt (Benoît Lurson): An introduction to the literary genres of Ancient Egypt is given. It is completed by a study of examples of of the genres, aimed at highlighting their formal characteristics. The students will actively participate by preptranslations or reviews.						
Content	This course consists of two successive parts. 1. Religion of the Ancient Near East (Jan Tavernier): - discussion of the beliefs developed in the following regions: Mesopotamia, Elam, Iran and Anatolia. 2. Literature of Ancient Egypt (Benoît Lurson): - corpus and theoritical approach.
