Main themes	<p>In-depth study of the texts of Pharaonic Egypt. Alternately with LGLOR2623, this course deals with the following themes:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Translation, with comments, of a literary text in Middle Egyptian (20 hours lectures); 3. Translation, with commentaries, of inscriptions from Ancient and Middle Kingdom (10 hours lectures).
Aims	<p>1 At the end of this course the student will be capable to read, transliterate and translate easily epigraphic and literary texts in Middle Egyptian.</p> <p>----- <i>The contribution of this Teaching Unit to the development and command of the skills and learning outcomes of the programme(s) can be accessed at the end of this sheet, in the section entitled "Programmes/courses offering this Teaching Unit".</i></p>
Evaluation methods	<p>Due to the COVID-19 crisis, the information in this section is particularly likely to change. Oral exam based on written preparation.</p>
Teaching methods	<p>Due to the COVID-19 crisis, the information in this section is particularly likely to change. Translations are done based on previous preparation by the students. The correction of the transliteration on the blackboard emphasises the structure and composition of the phrases, as well as an analysis of the verbal forms that are encountered. A commentary on the historical or religious questions completes the grammatical analysis of the text.</p>
Content	<p>The course aims to deepen and enlarge the knowledge and practice of the language that was learnt in the first cycle. According to the year, the themes treated will be studied in the light of the following texts:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The tale of Sinuhe, the tale of the Eloquent Peasant, the teaching of Ptahhotep, Neferty, Teachings... 2. Royal or private stela, rock inscriptions, private autobiographies.
