Main themes	An introduction to the Buddhist philology, axed on the ancient languages of south or central Asia. Alternating with LGLOR2752, this course deals with the grammar and vocabulary of one of the Buddhist languages of southern or central Asia (Indo-Aryan, Middle Iranian or Tokharian) as well as reading and commentary of selected texts in this language.

Content	The course is devoted to one of the languages in which Buddhist texts were formerly composed or translated. According to the year in question, the language will be either Indo-Aryan (Pâli, Gândhâri, Buddhist Sanskrit) or a Middle Iranian language (Khotanic, Sogdian) or Tokharian.
