Main themes	<p>An introduction to historic and comparative linguistics, as applied to Indo-european.</p> <p>This course deals with the following themes:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The history of the comparative study of the Indo-European languages;</li> <li>2. The principals and methods of genetic comparison;</li> <li>3. The phonological system of proto-Indo-European;</li> <li>4. Accenting and vocalic alternation;</li> <li>5. Word structure (root, suffix, ending);</li> <li>6. Nominal and verbal morphology.</li> </ol>

Content	A survey of the Indo-European languages and subgroups. Definition of the theory of genetic affinity. Procedures and objectives of linguistic reconstruction. Reconstruction of proto-Indo-European: phonological system (including the theory of glottals), morpho-phonological system (accent and apophony) and the morphological system (word structure).
