Main themes	This teaching unit focuses on interactive communication and the subjects will be field-related.

<p>Evaluation methods</p>	<p><b>Due to the COVID-19 crisis, the information in this section is particularly likely to change. Depending on the health context, the written evaluations on paper and the oral evaluation can be deferred to the January session and can be done on PC (TestWe, Wiseflow, Teams, ...).</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <i>Continuous</i> assessment (participation in class, writing of report on the placement, presentation that report, job interview and vocabulary test). This assessment counts for 50% in the final assessment.</li> <li>• <i>Oral exam</i> based on a file of presentations given in class. This exam counts for 50% in the final assessment.</li> <li>• In September, the student will have to take the oral exam again.</li> </ul>
<p>Teaching methods</p>	<p><b>Due to the COVID-19 crisis, the information in this section is particularly likely to change.</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Lessons in groups of max. 20 students</li> </ul> <p><b>• Subject to the health context and the number of students enrolled, this course will be given in face-to-face mode (if necessary one half cohort in the even weeks, the other half cohort in the odd weeks) combined with a volume of work to be done independently (syllabus+ Moodle). The contact hours will mainly focus on interactive communication and will also aim at anticipating or solving problems encountered in the work to be done independently.</b></p> <p>This teaching unit focuses on interactive communication within the professional framework. The proposed activities therefore aim at developing communication skills in that area, as well as improving the command of the language. These activities, which simulate real-life situations, are of two types:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. presentation and training of language functions related to professional life (contributing to / organizing and conducting a meeting, taking part in a job interview / a negotiation, writing formal letters ),</li> <li>2. individual and interactive speaking activities related to the placement. This part includes a report on the placement the student is doing, and a presentation of this report followed by an informal exchange of viewpoints. These activities require a certain amount of preparation on the part of the student, who also has to improve his or her linguistic knowledge autonomously (study of vocabulary and revision of grammar points by means of e-learning on Wallangues.be).</li> </ol>
<p>Content</p>	<p>This teaching unit aims at developing the Dutch communication skills of the student in order to enable him/her to function in the relevant social and professional contexts. More precisely it involves</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• the training of interactive communication,</li> <li>• the presentation and training of communication skills related to professional life (contributing to / organizing and conducting a meeting, taking part in a job interview / a negotiation, writing formal letters, writing and presentation of a report),</li> <li>• the improvement of the command of general and specific vocabulary and grammar in order to apply these communication skills.</li> </ul>
