The first part will consist of Multiple Response Questions (MRQs) for which the number of correct answers among the propositions can vary between 0 and n (total number of propositions of answers). This first part tests the basic theoretical knowledge of the course. It is worth 10 out of 20 points. The second part of the examination will consist of an open question assessing the in-depth knowledge of the course. It is worth 10 out of 20 points. Students must demonstrate mastery of the basic theoretical knowledge (i.e. obtain 50% of the points in the first part of the examination) in order to be assessed in the second part of the examination.
