The business plan oral presentation, on the last day at UNC, and the written work(15-20 pages) represent the major part of the grade (60%). Méthodes d'enseignement	<p>After having familiarized themselves with the theory of international entrepreneurship, students will work in binational teams on an international new venture project.</p> <p>The course will contain theoretical parts, but will mainly be organized around real-life entrepreneurial processes. All students will have to form an international team (2 UCL students - 2 students from a US university) and will be required to complete and present their own new international venture creation project in cooperation with the US students.</p> <p>The pedagogy will be interactive and will include common classes (videoconferencing, travels abroad if possible, company visits, etc.).</p> <p>The last three sessions will be devoted to the presentation and a discussion of the students' group works or projects. The course involves (if possible) a one-week trip to UNC Greensboro (USA) and a week during which Belgian students will host their US counterparts.</p>
