Evaluation methods	1. Compulsory Placement Test: at the beginning of the academic year, all students must take this ONLINE test (on Moodle). This test is the same level as the exam. On the basis of the results, students have access to the intensive or « normal » course/ coaching sessions. Top-ranked students (more than 14/20 at the placement test) will be invited to take an exemption test in the second week of the academic year. On the basis of the results, students can be exempted from the course and the final exam. 2. First-Term Test (20%): at the end of the first term, students MUST take a test assessing the vocabulary (videos/texts), grammar and reading/listening skills covered in class. 3. The Final (Written) Exam: The final exam takes place in May (cfr Moodle).
