Oral exam divided into 2 parts (60%) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • group exam (role play) • individual exam (presentation of a criminology-oriented topic based on a portfolio of articles) September exam (100% ou 60%) Same modalities as in January/June. The continuous assessment is taken into account if it is to the advantage of students.
Teaching methods	The LANGL 2423 course includes 30 hours of “classroom” activities as well as self-tuition on Moodle. <u>! Content	The course aims at enabling the student to function in the relevant social and professional contexts (law enforcement, the judicial world, the execution of criminal sentences, the field of prevention policies and psycho-social interventions). The student will practise the language in an interactive way through classroom professional-type activities and will therefore be exposed to a variety of real-life situations requiring specific language functions. Regular feedback on the student's oral production will help him consolidate and improve his grammar use, vocabulary accuracy as well as pronunciation.
