Main themes	<p>The course is based on real-life professional-type situations in the field of criminology.</p> <p>Teaching activity will focus on :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• taking part in a job interview (after writing a C.V. and a letter of application)</li> <li>• giving a talk on an institution</li> <li>• preparing and participating in a professional interview of a person needing the help of a criminologist</li> <li>• preparing and attending a professional meeting</li> </ul>
Learning outcomes	<p><b>At the end of this learning unit, the student is able to :</b></p> <p>The course aims at enabling the student</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• to write a letter of application and a CV</li> <li>• to take part in a job interview</li> <li>• to prepare a Powerpoint document on the institution in which he / she was a trainee</li> <li>• to make an oral presentation of his / her institution</li> <li>• to briefly describe the introductory situation of the professional interview as well as its protocol</li> <li>• to ask or answer questions at the professional interview</li> </ul> <p>1</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• to briefly describe the introductory situation of the professional meeting</li> <li>• to run and participate in a professional meeting</li> <li>• to develop the communication techniques appropriate to professional life,</li> </ul> <p>At the end of the term, the student should have acquired oral skills roughly corresponding to the B2 level of « the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages » for the following skills :</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. oral production</li> <li>2. written production</li> </ol>

January session :</b></p> <p>Continuous evaluation (written and oral parts)</p> <p><b>- Participation in the 4 projects (80%)</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• job application</li> <li>• presentation of the institution</li> <li>• professional interview</li> <li>• professional meeting</li> </ul> <p><b>- Active participation in class and level of spontaneous oral skills (20%)</b></p> <p><b>2. September session :</b></p> <p>The student who got less than 10/20 in January will only resit the project(s) he/she failed. The mark for active participation in class is not taken into account in September unless it is to the student's advantage. <b>(100% or 80%)</b></p>

<p>Teaching methods</p>	<p><b>! The teaching modalities may be subject to change in accordance with the evolution of the Covid-19 pandemic. The students will of course be notified of these possible changes in due course.</b></p> <p>The course is based on interactive communication. The activities proposed aim at consolidating and developing the communication techniques specific to a professional context while at the same time mastering the code required (general and specific vocabulary, grammar). These activities will involve role-plays involving the spoken and written language.</p> <p>The activities proposed are of two kinds</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. presentation by the teacher of the linguistic functions and techniques most directly related to professional life (job interviews, presentations, interviewing someone, meetings, ...) and activation of these skills in various role plays.</li> <li>2. presentation of assignments prepared by the students in connection with their placement: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• job interview (+ letter of application and CV)</li> <li>• presentation of the placement institution thanks to a PowerPoint document</li> <li>• interview of someone who needs the help of a criminologist</li> <li>• preparation of and participation in a professional meeting about a specific case</li> </ul> </li> </ol> <p>Before each class activity, the teacher places a range of tools (communication techniques, useful expressions, general and specialised vocabulary, grammatical reminders) and resources (written documents, audiovisual aids, web sites ...) at the students' disposal to enable the students to interact in communication situations in so far as they have been prepared beforehand. Feedback activities are also planned. Students are given detailed instructions before each activity.</p>
<p>Content</p>	<p>The course aims at enabling the student to function in the relevant social and professional contexts (law enforcement, the judicial world, the execution of criminal sentences, the field of prevention policies and psycho-social interventions).</p> <p><b>Individual oral production:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• being able to take part in a job interview and to apply for a vacancy in the institution in which the student is a trainee</li> <li>• being able to make a presentation of the institution in which the student is a trainee and to answer the questions of the audience</li> </ul> <p><b>Interactive oral production :</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• being able to interview a person needing the help of a criminologist in the relevant social and professional contexts</li> <li>• being able to give one's opinion at a professional meeting by explaining the arguments, the advantages and disadvantages of the different aspects in a logical, understandable and interactive way.</li> </ul> <p><b>Written production:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• being able to write down a curriculum vitae and a letter of application</li> <li>• being able to prepare a PowerPoint document on the institution in which he / she was a trainee</li> <li>• being able to briefly describe the introductory situation of a professional interview as well as its protocol</li> <li>• being able to briefly describe the introductory situation of the professional meeting</li> </ul>
