Learning outcomes	<p>At the end of this learning unit, the student is able to :</p> <p>By completing a individual final project, students will demonstrate their ability to develop a philosophical hypothesis which is well documented and argued.</p> <p>In particular, they will demonstrate their ability to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) develop a philosophical topic and deal with it in an informed and coherent way. 2) make appropriate use of research tools by meeting prevailing academic criteria. 3) formulate a hypothesis and set out the underlying argument coherently, clearly and in a well-structured way.
Evaluation methods	<p>Written work is assessed by the supervisor and two readers.</p> <p>Students are required to respond to questions put to them by their supervisor and two readers at an oral defense.</p>
