Place of the course	Louvain-la-Neuve
Prerequisites	The course requires an introduction to moral philosophy at the bachelor level and a good reading knowledge of English.
Main themes	In order to attain the objectives that have been set, the course will concentrate each year on a different theme that will allow the relationships between different orientations in philosophical ethics to be seen - concrete issues of "applied" ethics and methodological reflection. The conceptual analysis will be accompanied by case studies.
Learning outcomes	<p>At the end of this learning unit, the student is able to :</p> <p>By the end of the course the student shall be able</p> <p>1</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - to analyse selected topics in the field of moral philosophy; - to develop a well argued point of view, taking a position relative to various approaches to ethics; - to use appropriately the tools of research in philosophy and in interdisciplinary collaboration.
Evaluation methods	The elements of evaluation are the regular and active participation, the writing of a short essay (maximum 5 pages on a subject that can be chosen among the topics of the course) and an oral exam.
Teaching methods	There will be lectures and important interactive moments based on texts that have to be read by all participants. French will be the working language of this course.
