Teaching methods	<p>Various teaching formats including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• course sessions by the professor in charge,</li> <li>• presentations by stakeholders in education,</li> <li>• interactive group discussions.</li> </ul> <p>The course will be given face-to-face (or via TEAMS if necessary - for example in the event of a health crisis such as COVID).</p>
Content	The course aims to encourage and facilitate reflection on the objectives and methods of foreign language teaching in general and in FWB in particular. The components ("variables") of the teaching situation will be presented, as well as the different methods of teaching and learning modern languages. The official texts (decree and references, teaching programmes) will be analysed in the light of the "Common European Framework of Reference for Languages".
