Main themes	Students will be introduced to the countries, history and culture of people and communities in the Near East with Christian (non-catholic) beliefs. Special regions with Aramaic (Syriac) population in Syria-Mesopotamia are brought into focus. The course introduces into several topics:			
	1. Countries and regions of Eastern Christian communities and their history from the 4th century to Medieval times;2. Christian Oriental sciences and litteratures;			
	3. Cultural urban centres (Alexandria, Antiochia, Edessa, Mosul, Baghdad etc.) and important monastic places (in Palestine, Turqey, Syria, Iran, Egypt, Sinai etc.);			
	4. Main historical features of Syriac christianity in the Near East from the 4th century to modern times; its former cultural impact in Central Asia and India.

They will learn to use the main sources and reference books for carrying out (individually or in group) a small research topic and presenting it to the class.
