Main themes	Alternating with the course LGLOR2671, this course covers the following topics: 1. elements of historical and comparative grammar of the Indo-Aryan languages; 2. elements of typology of Indo-Aryan languages (from Old Indo-Aryan / Sanskrit to modern Indo-Aryan languages), in synchronic and diachronic perspectives.
Learning outcomes	At the end of this learning unit, the student is able to : 1 have an analytical understanding of the peculiarities of the Indo-Aryan languages from a historical-comparative and typological point of view; 2 understand the major developments in the history of the Indo-Aryan languages.
Evaluation methods	Oral exam
Teaching methods	Lectures together with an exercise of synthesis and presentation by the student on a proposed topic.
