Prerequisites	LGLOR1542 and/or LGLOR1671/1672 or knowledge of Sanskrit estimated sufficient by the teacher.
Main themes	An introduction to the Buddhist philology, axed on the ancient languages of South and Central Asia. The course deals with the grammar and vocabulary of one or several of the Buddhist languages of South and Central Asia: Indo-Aryan languages (Buddhist Sanskrit, Pali, Gandhari), Middle Iranian languages (Khotanese, Sogdian), Tokharian languages, Old Uyghur, Classical Tibetan or Mongolian; as well as the reading and commentary of selected texts.
Learning outcomes	At the end of this learning unit, the student is able to: read and interpret original Buddhist texts in one of the languages studied.
Evaluation methods	Oral exam.
Teaching methods	Lectures (given over to the grammar and vocabulary of the selected language) and reading and analysis of texts prepared by the student.
Inline resources	The online working tools related to the course are provided to the students directly or via Moodle.
Other infos	English-friendly course: course taughtt in French but offering facilities in English. Facilities also offered in Dutch, German and Russian.
