Content	This interuniversity FNRS seminar provides a useful complement to the advanced level courses of Sanskrit, dealing with questions of palaeography, epigraphy, critical edition, history of texts or the study of native commentaries. Among the specialised recurrent themes, the questions concerning southern Indian epigraphy and the study of Malayalam writing are worthy of note.
