Learning outcomes	
Evaluation methods	<p>As this is a continuous assessment course, attendance at this course is required. In accordance with article 72 of the General Regulations for Studies and Examinations, the Professors may propose to the jury that a student who has at least three unjustified absences for the course, be refused registration for the January, June or September session.</p> <p>Evaluation is continuous and takes the form of multiple choice questions or quizzes to be taken after certain face-to-face courses. The sum of the results obtained constitutes the final grade.</p> <p>In the second session, the exam is a MCQ or a take-home exam that covers all the material covered in the course.</p>
Teaching methods	The course is lectured. Interactivity is stimulated.
Content	<p>The course addresses the main ethical issues that arise in the professions that criminologists may practice. Each aspect of the subject is developed in a general manner and illustrated by an examination of the codes and regulations specific to the various professions as well as by case studies.</p> <p>This course is intended to provide criminology students with tools before they begin their internship.</p>
