Main themes	<p>1) The dissertation should develop the hypothesis put forward in the dissertation preparation seminar in a precise, clear and well-documented way.</p> <p>2) It should deal with a specialised issue from the starting point of an in-depth interpretation of a series of reference texts.</p> <p>3) Students are required to respond to questions put to them by their supervisor and two readers at an oral defense.</p>
Learning outcomes	<p><b>At the end of this learning unit, the student is able to :</b></p> <p>By doing the Master's dissertation, students will demonstrate their ability, under the direction of a supervisor, to carry out an in-depth piece of philosophical research, which should be well documented and original.</p> <p>In particular, they will show how they are able to</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) deal with a philosophical subject in an informed and synthetic way</li> <li>2) make appropriate use of research tools in line with prevailing academic criteria</li> <li>3) formulate a hypothesis and draft the supporting argument in a logical, clear and structured way</li> <li>4) make clear what assumptions underlie the hypothesis and the method adopted</li> <li>5) present and defend the result of the research.</li> </ol>
