Main themes	The course provides an opportunity to put into practice the knowledge of different aspects of the Ancient Near Eastern civilizations.			
Learning outcomes	At the end of this learning unit, the student is able to: carry out a research project in relation to the organised activities and to present the results. To this end, they are required to show initiative and develop a sense of responsibility.			
Evaluation methods	The assessment combines (1) an evaluation by the supervisor and (2) the 10-page philological research paper according to the following breakdown: 25% for the evaluation and 75% for the philological research paper.			
Teaching methods	Practical training under the supervision of an internship supervisor and writing of a scientific work under the supervision of the thesis promoter.			
Content	The internship allows for the development of personal work skills according to the standards of the discipline and provides a first immersion in a professional environment.
