Prerequisites	Intermediate Japanese Language skills are required (i.e. LJAPO1300). The student is expected to be able to write and read all signs of hiragana and katakana.
Main themes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Different "TE" Forms of verbs • Conjugating verbs • Explain one's aim • Comparative forms • "TE" forms of adjectives • More natural and day-use Japanese expressions • Vocabulary, Kanji
Learning outcomes	<p>At the end of this learning unit, the student is able to :</p> <p>This course aims to provide the students with the opportunities to improve and enrich their linguistic abilities.</p>
Evaluation methods	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Attending the course more than more 80 % is a primordial condition to get access to the assessment process. • Steady assessment of speaking and writing abilities during the academic year. The result of the steady assessment of the 1st semester could be considered as a note of 'partial exam of January', according to 'Décret Paysage'. • Final examination at the end of the academic year, to evaluate grammar, writing, listening, dictation and oral expression skills. This exam probably occurs out of official exam session schedule. • Several self-evaluation tests will be organized, on Moodle page - on-line test.
Teaching methods	<p>A traditional class teaching method and interactive learning method are both used. One is particularly used to provide the students with explanations of grammar and kanji, and the other is used to offer more opportunities to them to take part in the discovery, practice and mastering of new grammar topics and vocabulary.</p> <p>As default : face-to-face teaching method. However, due to Covid-19 prevention context, the course could be organized by on-line base, only if the situation of Covid-19 propagation requires.</p>
Content	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Enrichment of Japanese Language skills (grammar, writing and reading) and improvement of communication level (oral and aural expressions). • At this stage of learning, the student should take more initiative to contribute to an interactive class atmosphere.
