<p>Evaluation methods</p>	<p><i>Depending on the health context and the availability of large auditoriums, paper-based and oral assessments can be postponed to the January session and/or can be done on PC (e.g. onTeams).</i></p> <p>The aim of assessment is to measure the achievement of the learning outcomes</p> <p><i>Absence from one of the two examinations (either the written exam or the oral exam) will result in a final mark of absence.</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Mid-term test on vocabulary and irregular verbs (10%) - open questions - Oral exam in the last week of the term (40%).- open questions - Written exam during the exam period (50%).- open questions and multiple choices <p>In September, the student will have to take the written (60%) and oral (40%) exams again.</p>
