Place of the course	Louvain-la-Neuve					
Main themes	To achieve its objectives, the course consists of:  - presenting a historical and doctrinal synthesis of the question of the one God and Triune;  - introducing to the current problems, situating them in the contemporary context;  - initiating the practice of dogmatic theology.  This part of the course includes an introduction to the elaboration of a problem and a practical introduction to the bibliographic instruments; it leads the student to write a work which gives him/her the opportunity to put into practice the elements of this initiation and to develop an active relation with the material.

Evaluation methods	The exam consists of two questions, one on a point of the course to be presented (the choice of the question is made by drawing lots), with 15 minutes of preparation (series 1), the other consisting in presenting a work, sent to the teacher 48 hours before the exam (series 2); duration of the exam: 15 minutes. The work is sent to the professor's e-mail address 48 hours before the exam.</li> <li>Ex: God in the Gospel of John.</li> </ol>
