Prerequisites	<i>The prerequisite(s) for this Teaching Unit (Unité d'enseignement – UE) for the programmes/courses that offer this Teaching Unit are specified at the end of this sheet.</i>
Learning outcomes	<p>At the end of this learning unit, the student is able to :</p> <p>The aim of this course is to explain the key theoretical concepts related to the three semiotic approaches presented. It also aims to construct an analytical approach from the concepts developed, in order to understand the meaning process of communication systems.</p>
Evaluation methods	<p>On the one hand, the course is evaluated on the basis of an individual oral exam in session. It covers both the mastery of the theoretical part and the ability to analyze the communication tool produced by the students, based on the analysis grids provided.</p> <p>On the other hand, the quality of this production (the integration of the instructions given in each workshop and the final production) is evaluated collectively (group work). Students' participation in the three workshops is included in the evaluation. In case of absence, a justification is required.</p>
Teaching methods	<p>The pedagogical approach blends different modalities: face-to-face sessions, autonomous work and small group coaching. It includes a theoretical part and a practical part.</p> <p>Theoretical part: the content is presented and discussed through face-to-face sessions (presentation of the theory and analysis of examples) in order to check the students' understanding and to answer their questions.</p> <p>Practical part: students will be asked to design a media device in three workshops (group work). The workshops are organized face-to-face.</p> <p>Students' participation in the three workshop sessions is required. It is also recommended that students work on their project in a collaborative way outside of the workshops using the digital tools at their disposal.</p>
