Content	The course will inform students about the content of the Judeo-Christian Bible and the history of its formation. It will then show how various theological currents have found their place in the biblical corpus. A commented reading of narrative texts that have never ceased to resonate in the history of European culture will be proposed. Finally, some commonly held ideas about the Bible will be critically examined.
