Teaching methods	Tutorials in class (mandatory attendance) and homework.
Content	Specialized translation workshops are made up of two parts. The first part is devoted to administrative and legal translation from French into LSFB (15h). The second part is devoted to the translation of specialized topics, particularly in the legal and medical fields, from LSFB into French (30 hours).
