Evaluation methods	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Over the course of the term : formative assessment. <p>The student's presence is requested at all in-situ training sessions of the translation workshops. In case of an unjustified and repeated absence at the training sessions, the student may be sanctioned, according to article 72 of the General Regulations for Studies and Examinations, the teachers being allowed to propose to the jury to oppose the registration for the June or August/September sessions of a student who has not attended at least 80% of the course.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • June and August/September sessions: summative assessment <p>The first session (June session) overall evaluation [100 % of the final mark] covers the student's work accomplished during the workshop : the evaluation of the course - certified translation from Russian into French - will be conducted with reference to the terms and specifications of the tasks and practical exercises he or she will be submitted to, as well as according to the quality criteria and procedures required in this specific field of translation. In the event of non-delivery of the work within the required time, the student may be sanctioned, according to article 72 of the General Regulations for Studies and Examinations, the teachers being allowed to propose to the jury to oppose the registration for the June or September sessions of the student.</p> <p>The final evaluation of the translation workshop may be completed by an in-situ 4-hour translation exam to be completed in the working conditions of a professional translator's workstation during the official examination session. The student will be given one or more texts directly related to the special field of study of the semester. The exam will cover both the student's theoretical knowledge and practical translation competence in the field. [In that case, both parts of the evaluation will count for 50 % of the final mark each.]</p> <p>The second session (September session) overall evaluation [100% of the final mark] consists of an in-situ 4-hour translation exam in the working conditions of a professional translator's workstation. The exam will cover both the student's theoretical knowledge and practical translation competence in the field. The evaluation will be conducted according to the quality criteria and procedures required in the specific field of translation.</p> <p><i>The use of MT (machine translation) is strictly forbidden in any translation exercise or examination work, unless explicitly specified otherwise - where applicable - in the specific context of a post-editing exercise proposed by the teacher for teaching purposes. Similarly, the use of any software or application based on AI (artificial intelligence), such as ChatGPT, is strictly forbidden in writing and editing exercises.</i></p> <p><i>In any case, a paper to be presented or submitted as part of the course or examination session will be a personal work that reflects the student's personal skills. Teaching methods	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In-situ lectures and training sessions. • Preliminary homework according to instructions given by the teacher via the e-learning platform. <p>The workshop consists of 7 in-situ training sessions of 2 hours each.</p> <p>The workshop will start with an introduction to the general theory of certified translation (session 1), followed by 6 sessions each of which will be dedicated to specific text types. Every session will consist in the critical discussion and comment of the exercises and tasks (theoretical introduction, theoretical readings, exercises and practical translation work) prepared at home.</p> <p>The student's presence is requested at all in-situ training sessions of the translation workshop.</p> <p><i>The use of MT (machine translation) is strictly forbidden in any translation exercise or examination work, unless explicitly specified otherwise - where applicable - in the specific context of a post-editing exercise proposed by the teacher for teaching purposes.
