DEGE2MC - Admission

Decree of March 31st 2004 defining higher education, favoring its integration in the European framework of higher education and refinancing universities.

The admission requirements have to be met at the time of enrolment at the university.

All information can be obtained from the [University's Enrolment Office \(Service des inscriptions – SIC\)](#).

The following students, after meeting the conditions set by the academic authorities, have access to the complementary Master's degree with the aim of obtaining the grade that these studies sanction:

- An academic Master's degree within the same field allowing 2nd-cycle studies, including at least 120 credits
- An academic Master's degree, following a decision by the academic authorities, under the complementary conditions that they set and as a result of a motivated decision by the jury
- An academic grade which is similar to those mentioned above, issued by the Flemish Community, the German Community or the Royal Military Academy, under the same conditions
- A foreign academic grade that has been acknowledged as being equivalent to those mentioned above, in application of this decree, a European-level directive or an international convention, under the same conditions
- Under the same conditions, one or several titles or academic grade issued by the Flemish Community, the German Community or the Royal Military Academy, sanctioning 2nd-cycle studies and valued at least 300 credits by the jury, or sanctioning 2nd-cycle studies and valued at least 240 credits completed of 60 credits, the all that must be valued by the jury according to the decree of March 31st, 2004 (art 54, 5 °)

In the event of the divergence between the different linguistic versions of the present conditions, the French version shall prevail

Specific Admission Requirements

Special procedures :

- candidates must have a 'licence' degree or a Master's degree in Dentistry from a Belgian university or a degree recognized as being equivalent by the relevant authorities and be able to practise in Belgium
- candidates must show evidence of having been selected as a generalist at a Belgian faculty of medicine

Further information about the legal requirements and the practical details of the selection examination may be obtained from the office.

The Royal Decree of 30 May 2002 on the availability of dentistry studies, published on 18 June 2002, applies to candidates who wish to gain professional status as general dentists. (These candidates therefore fall into the category of generalists or specialists in the restricted intake.)

Applications should be submitted to the academic in charge of the programme.

DEGE2MC - Information

Learning outcomes

The objective of this Advanced 2nd cycle programme is to prepare dentists to gain professional status as general dentists. (Ministerial Decree of 29 March 2002 published 31 May 2002).

Evaluation

Students' practical and theoretical knowledge is assessed. The dissertation is also assessed.

When the above requirements have been fulfilled, the programme committee will award the academic qualification of Advanced Master in General Dentistry. This is not a substitute for recognition by the ministerial committee. It is evidence of academic and scientific training in the context of specialized training leading to the award of professional status.

DEGE2MC - Detailed programme

Programme structure

The training lasts one year on a full-time basis and is made up of a theoretical part (at least 250 hours) and a practical clinical part (at least 1,250 hours). The placements include duty activities. A dissertation of at least 10 pages must be written on a subject approved by the official committee.

Programme by subject

The theoretical training comprises :

- seminars (180 hours) on integrated approaches to the patient (discussion of treatment plans and case reports where there is possible interaction with other specialized disciplines and general medical disciplines).
- the part, common to all the training programmes, which leads to the award of professional status in dentistry (70 hours). This part comprises training for independent professional practice as well as interactive seminars on the following topics: economic aspects of bucco-dental treatment, the organization and management of a dental surgery, professional regulation and responsibility, dental computer systems, critical analysis of scientific literature, introduction to legal dentistry, introduction to communication, ergonomics, radiodiagnosis including radioprotection, ethological aspects of health care and the relationship between first and second line health care.

The course is taught by an inter-university team of lecturers including the professional associations.

during the clinical training, and in the spirit of combined dentistry, candidates must carry out an adequate number of preventive and rehabilitative treatments on an adequate number of patients and write up the reports. The combined treatments carried out by candidates should include as many disciplines from the basic training as possible.
