FILO1PM - Introduction

Your programme

Depending on the student's previous academic record, the programme (of a maximum of 60 credits) will be made up of a group of courses selected in consultation with the study adviser and the secretary of the examination board. These courses are to be chosen from the Bachelor's degree programme in Philosophy.

FILO1PM - Admission

For the specific conditions of this program : refer to the French version

(Decree of March 31st 2004 defining higher education, favoring its integration in the European framework of higher education and refinancing universities)

The admission requirements must be met prior to enrolment in the university.

General conditions

Access to the preparatory year on the basis of a bridging programme:

- Access to the preparatory year for students who have a [non-university "short-type" higher education degree](#)
- Access to the preparatory year for students who have a [non-university "long-type" higher education degree](#)

Upon completion of the Master's admission procedure , students may be required to take extra courses representing a maximum of 60 additional credits. Where the extra workload exceeds 15 credits, this training is considered to be a preparatory year of study.

- **Access to the preparatory year on the basis of [accreditation of prior learning and skills acquired through personal or professional experience](#)** :

Article 53 of the Decree of 30 March 2004 stipulates that: *"Notwithstanding article 51, without prejudice to article 60, and in accordance with a decision by the academic authorities, for the purpose of granting access to Master's studies, the competent Examination Board may accredit prior learning and skills acquired by students through their personal or professional experience. This useful experience must correspond to at least five years of activities, excluding years of higher education study that were not passed. At the end of an assessment procedure organized by the academic authorities, the Examination Board will decide whether a student has sufficient knowledge and skills to successfully pursue Master's studies."*

- **Access to the preparatory year on the basis of accreditation of 180 ECTS credits by the Admissions Board (personalized admission based on application)** for students who have a degree from a Belgian university or qualifications obtained abroad (which do not give access to this particular year on the basis of the abovementioned general conditions).

In the event of the divergence between the different linguistic versions of the present conditions, the French version shall prevail

FILO1PM - Information

Learning outcomes

The preparatory year provides students with the basic knowledge and skills in philosophy to help them successfully follow the [Master \[60\] in Philosophy](#) or the [Master \[120\] in Philosophy](#).

The programme aims to provide a basic training in philosophy and give the student a thorough initiation to the world of philosophy.

Teaching method

The programme of courses for each student is made up in the light of their previous academic record and is designed to equip them with the necessary prerequisites to gain access to a Master's degree.

The courses make use of a variety of teaching techniques and strategies (lectures, group work, individual work, seminars, reading etc.) which help students to acquire the necessary skills. Certain courses also use e-learning techniques (provision of resources and exercises, teaching devices, collective sharing and assessment of work).

Evaluation

Depending on the nature of the course and the teaching methods, the evaluation will take different forms. Some courses will involve oral and/or written evaluations (held during one of the three exam sessions: January – June – August/September), whilst the evaluation of seminars will involve more substantial student participation as well as assessment of individual course work. Evaluation methods will be explained at the beginning of each course.

Teaching methods are evaluated in accordance with the current University regulations (see [General regulations concerning examinations](#)). Students may also find additional information regarding the evaluation of courses in the course description.

Possible trainings at the end of the programme

The foundation year does not lead to a diploma, but successful completion of the year does give access to the [Master \[60\] in Philosophy](#) as well as to the [Master \[120\] in Philosophy](#). Only students who have completed the year satisfactorily will be awarded a certificate.
