Learning outcomes

This programme is designed for students who have already gained a Master and are turning to the **Advanced Master in Interdisciplinary Analysis of European Construction** to gain additional special training in the field of European studies to establish a link with professional activities relating to the institutions and policies of the European Union.

It provides teaching in the legal, economic, political and historical foundations of European integration as well as an interdisciplinary seminar which tackles various issues relating to this.

There is a choice between three special option courses : Dimensions and Means of European Policies, Europe, States and Societies and Europe in the World. These enable students to deepen their knowledge in one of these areas.

Advanced teaching on subjects relating to European construction also gives students opportunities to consider more deeply the processes at work and to adopt a critical attitude towards them.

The programme is organized jointly by the Institute of European Studies at UCL and the Saint-Louis University - Brussels (where the courses are held).

Programme structure

This programme of 60 credits is made up of courses and seminars, as well as a final assignment. The core subjects are organized mainly in the first semester.

The second semester is devoted to the production of a final assignment (18 credits) and a specialization for 10 credits in option courses.

All the courses are held at the Saint-Louis University - Brussels, 3 x 3 hours per week (18h-21h).

EUHD2MC - Information

Admission

In the event of the divergence between the different linguistic versions of the present conditions, the French version shall prevail

Decree of March 31st 2004 defining higher education, favoring its integration in the European framework of higher education and refinancing universities.

The admission requirements have to be met at the time of enrolment at the university.

The mentioned information may of modification for 2014-2015

All information can be obtained from the [University's Enrolment Office \(Service des inscriptions – SIC\)](#).

The following students, after meeting the conditions set by the academic authorities, have access to the complementary Master's degree with the aim of obtaining the grade that these studies sanction:

- An academic Master's degree within the same field allowing 2nd-cycle studies, including at least 120 credits
- An academic Master's degree, following a decision by the academic authorities, under the complementary conditions that they set and as a result of a motivated decision by the jury
- An academic grade which is similar to those mentioned above, issued by the Flemish Community, the German Community or the Royal Military Academy, under the same conditions
- A foreign academic grade that has been acknowledged as being equivalent to those mentioned above, in application of this decree, a European-level directive or an international convention, under the same conditions
- Under the same conditions, one or several titles or academic grade issued by the Flemish Community, the German Community or the Royal Military Academy, sanctioning 2nd-cycle studies and valued at least 300 credits by the jury, or sanctioning 2nd-cycle studies and valued at least 240 credits completed of 60 credits, the all that must be valued by the jury according to the decree of March 31st, 2004 (art 54, 5 °)

Teaching method

This Advanced Master tackles European studies from a multidisciplinary perspective which accounts for its originality and special features. It applies the resources of political science, law, economics and history to the study of European integration. Students acquire the basic knowledge which enables them to understand the foundations of European construction.

The interdisciplinary seminar 'Thinking Europe' develops the interdisciplinary aspect.

The teaching staff is made up of both academics who specialize in the subjects studied and practitioners from the institutions and common policies who can shed light on how they actually work and who represent a source of expertise for students.

Evaluation

The evaluation methods comply with the [regulations concerning studies and exams](#). More detailed explanation of the modalities specific to each learning unit are available on their description sheets under the heading "Learning outcomes evaluation method".

Assessment may take the form of written or oral examinations. The final assignment is assessed on the basis of a piece of written work, in accordance with guidelines set out by the supervisor who is unique evaluator for the final assignment.
