Learning outcomes

The program, which amounts to 30 credits, is intended to be an interdisciplinary subject as it offers courses in law, economics, history and civilization and political science. The aims of the course are twofold: equip students with general theoretical training which meets university demand in the field of European integration whilst at the same time providing them with an introduction to what's going on in the European integration process in the 'European current affairs' class, as well as getting students started on documentary research into European affairs.

On successful completion of this programme, each student is able to :

1. Maîtriser, avec la rigueur exigée par les études européennes, les fondements théoriques (connaissances, concepts, outils, ...) qui constituent les prérequis indispensables dans une perspective de (ré)orientation vers le master en études européennes.
2. Faire preuve d'une capacité d'un mode de raisonnement spécifique aux études européennes avec rigueur.
3. Appréhender, questionner, analyser, discuter et résoudre une problématique d'études européennes, en mobilisant les fondements disciplinaires et méthodologiques pertinents.
4. Développer un angle de lecture et une analyse critique et réflexive spécifiques aux études européennes.

Access Requirements

The minor in European Studies is open to all baccalaureate students of UCLouvain as far as the major cursus allows the student to do it. (See [here](#).) There are no entry requirements and there are no restrictions to the number of students allowed on the course.

Teaching method

The course, which is worth 30 credits, is designed to be interdisciplinary, with lessons in law, economics, history and civilisation, and political science. It has a twofold objective: to provide students with a general, university-level theoretical background to European integration, while also introducing them to the reality of this process.

Evaluation
