

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS – MASTER'S

1: General admission requirement

A relevant Bachelor's degree equivalent to a Danish Bachelor's degree in length and level (120 ECTS).

2: Specific admission requirements

Typically 60 to 90 ECTS within specific subject areas

3: English language requirement

A test recognised by AU such as TOEFL or IELTS* *Exemptions apply


