A look back at a rich and inspiring trimester

As we reflect on the past trimester, we recognize it has been particularly rich in events.

Honoring responsible AI and ethical research

First, I would like to revisit the SST DHC ceremony. During this ceremony, four outstanding personalities were honored with a DHC under the theme "**Responsible AI for Human Development**." It was an incredible opportunity to meet and engage with scientists who not only excel in their respective fields but also embody a profound sense of humanity.

Notably, the LIDAM, in collaboration with the Faculty of Bioengineers, awarded a DHC to Prof. **Yves Moreau**, professor of bioinformatics at KU Leuven, specializing in the intersection of artificial intelligence and clinical genomics. He is deeply committed to **ethical technology** and actively works **against the misuse of forensic DNA databases** and **mass surveillance**. His research aims to develop practical tools for the biomedical field while ensuring data security and ethical standards. Moreau's societal engagement includes advocating for social justice and sustainability in technological innovation.

During his visit, Yves Moreau delivered several talks, including a **keynote presentation** and **workshops**, all of which were deeply inspiring. He wisely and emphatically encouraged us to

reflect on the ethics and transparency of our research. As noted by **Laura Symul**, his LIDAM godmother for the event:

"Yves Moreau is leading by example, and hopefully, he is a very relatable example. His actions inspire us to consider the consequences of science and technology and to use our understanding of these technologies to prevent their ethical misuse."

The LIDAM is extremely proud to count Prof. Yves Moreau among its DHCs, and we hope this marks the **beginning of further collaboration in the future**.

Welcoming new colleagues

Our "Christmas event," which was more of a "New Year event" this time, took place in January and served as a wonderful occasion to warmly welcome our new academic colleagues: **Stefan, Karim, and Quentin**. We are delighted and proud to have them join our institute.

Reaffirming our values in a troubled world

Finally, it is impossible to ignore the impact of **worldwide political events**. In this context, we feel it is crucial to reaffirm the importance of **free, independent, and globally open** research. This freedom is indispensable for ensuring rigorous and enlightened scientific advancements that serve society.

In alignment with this principle, the LIDAM Bureau has made the decision to deactivate its X account (formerly Twitter) and remains vigilant—with the support of UCLouvain authorities—about the difficulties some researchers may face in light of current complicated situations in different countries.

Though conflicts and infringements on education and research freedom appear to be increasing, I encourage you not to lose your motivation—and, even if it feels naive, your hope—that **our teachings and research can contribute to creating a better world**.

As someone wisely remarked on the radio recently (his name, unfortunately, escapes me):

Education expenses should be considered part of defense spending.

I completely agree with this idea, which is clearly more than just a matter of money. It invites us to enlarge the concept of education to also encompass independent, ethical, and high-quality research.



Wrapping up 2024, welcoming 2025


