## **Aims**

- ° Expose the major theories and fundemental concepts in sociological criminology.
- ° Develop analytical skills required for critical appraisal of criminological research
- ° Introduce to sociological reasoning and practice as applied to deviance and social control, crime and legal punishment (formulation of research hypotheses, analysis of empirical data)

## Main themes

This course surveys major theoretical approaches to deviance and social control, and to crime and legal punishment.

## Content and teaching methods

#### Contents:

The theories surveyed are:

- (1) The social disorganization and ecological theories
- (2) The subcultural and strain theories
- (3) The differential association and social learning theories
- (4) The anomie and structural-functionalist theories
- (5) The labelling and social-constructionist theories
- (6) The power-conflict and marxist theories

Teaching Methods:

Lecture course and seminars (practical exercises). Attendance at all lectures ans seminars is required.
