It is thus not a question here of addressing a professional goal of the Faculty (for example, the ethics or deontology of teaching). This is a course providing religious training and information, with the same rigour that could be expected by the student of any university course. Addressing a question of Christian faith, this course may just as well demonstrate its anthropological importance to a non-believer, as its truth and meaning to a believer wanting to deepen his/her faith.
