Aims

- to go into detail in the knowledge in the field of adolescent development.
- to draw the educational and clinical implications of this theoretical knowledge

Main themes

- Adolescence is tackled in the frame of a clinical psychology of development, whose foundings are the cognitivo-behavioural theories and the works on the identity and the reactions to the critical life events.
- different themes will be studied: the anthropological aspects of adolescence; the adolescence as crisis and conflict; puberty and sexuality; moral development and negociation strategies; identity; control, autonomy and life competencies; adolescents in difficulty...
