#### Aims

By the end of this course, the student should be able: to enter into the theological questions of existence and the nature of God; to elucidate the relationship between natural knowledge of God and the Christian belief in God; to counter the criticisms that modern atheism addresses to the belief in God.

#### Main themes

The course covers the following: the main lines of a rational elaboration of the affirmation of God; the Christian idea of the incomprehensible and ineffable God; the Protestant criticism of "natural theology"; the different forms of the negation of God in modern atheism and the different ways in which theology discusses them.

#### Content and teaching methods

These lessons examine the various types of modern atheism and the different ways of affirming the existence of God by reason.
