Admission conditions

This programme is accessible to students coming in from the following categories :

1. diploma holders from the first cycle of university studies ("candidature") in Management Sciences or Economic Sciences and Management from a university of the French-speaking Community of Belgium, either obtained after the second year of studies or in the form of a single "candidature" year;
2. diploma holders from the first cycle of university studies ("candidature") in Management Sciences, delivered by a Belgian university, or diploma holders from the first cycle of university studies who are judged by the Department as having a sufficient basis of education for the programme. This must include subjects which correspond to the following courses :
 - 1. Macroeconomics
 - 2. Microeconomics
 - 3. Mathematics I and II
 - 4. Statistics in Economy and Management
 - 5. Accountancy
 - 6. Analysis of Financial States
 - 7. Commercial Law
 - 8. Computer Studies in Economics and Management
 - 9. Business English and either Dutch or German at intermediate level.

In the context of the special exams ("passerelles") organised within the French Community of Belgium between non-university further educational and university educational institutes, this programme in Management Sciences is accessible to :

- holders of a diploma of the *second cycle of university studies ("licence") from the economics category*, subject to the possible addition of complementary subjects to the first year of the "licence" programme ;
- holders of a diploma of the first cycle of university studies (" *candidat*") *from the Economics category as well as industrial engineers*, subject to passing an entrance exam and possibly adding a limited number of complementary subjects to the first year of the "licence" (maximum : 150 hours) ;
- holders of a diploma from a non-university institute of higher education in accountancy, marketing, insurances, transport management, external commerce or in computer studies, as well as those who hold a lower classess secondary school teaching certificate in the economics category ("agrégation"), subject to *successfully completing one year of training prior to the course*.

Non-university further education Diploma holders from a non-Economics category may have access to the "licence" in Management Sciences on the basis of a "candidat" diploma in Management Sciences or Economic and Management Sciences which may be obtained in certain cases on the basis of a single year of "candidature".

All admission applications and requests for complementary information should be addressed to the Department of Administration and Management.

Admission applications and requests for information linked to the single candidature (" *candidature unique* "), should be adressed to the secretary's office for the "Candidature" in Economic, Social and Political Sciences.

The students have the possibility to complete a quadrimester of their second year of studies (ECAP 22) in a foreign university in Europe, in the context of the Socrates programme, namely : Universität Innsbrück (A), UFSIA (Anvers) (B), KU Leuven (B), WHU Koblenz (D), Copenhagen Business School (DK), Aarhus Business School (DK), ICADE (Madrid) (E), Universidad de Deusto (E), Universidad de Cantabria (Santander) (E), Universidad de Barcelona (E), University of Zaragoza (E) Université R. The students who participate in this scheme will be selected by a "jury" in March of the first year of the programme.

Evaluation

The thesis is presented before a jury composed of the thesis director and an academic reporter, and counts for a quarter of the total marks during the deliberation. The course work accounts for the remaining three quarters. In the case of exchanges, the marks obtained abroad represent half of the ponderation consacrated to the "course work" part of the final evaluation.

Positioning of the degree within the University cursus

The university degree with distinction in Management Sciences entitles access to all the master programmes in specialisation in Management - a dispensation for the distinction may be requested for analysis on a case by case basis. These specialisations (DES) are as follows : DES in Economics and Management (ECGE 3 DS), Management, Computer Studies or Financial Economics orientations : master's programmes in Management to prepare for doctoral research : the DEA in Economics and Management (ECGE 3DA). Furthermore, this diploma also entitles access to all the complementary second cycle studies of the Faculty of Economic, Social and Political Sciences or of certain other Faculties.
