Aims

- to develop a transcultural reference frame allowing the psychology students to position the theories and practices studied during their cursus.
- to supply a coherent survey of the major themes constituting the main currents of the anthropological thinking.

Main themes

Version: 13/03/2007

- critical presentation of the main current methods in anthropological research
- definition of basic concepts such as "culture", "system", "social relationships", "acculturation", "participating observation"... while developing synchronic (intercultural comparisons) and diachronic (intracultural comparisons along time) reference frame.
- accross illustrative themes (ex: family, death, madness), development of 4 main issues:
- a) the cultural diversity and its nature
- b) the cultural causality and assessment as unyielding sizes of man
- c) the relationship between the cultural and the psychic
- d) how these major themes have been considered by various schools.
