ACADEMICS

Academic Calendar	The academic year officially runs from 1st October to 30th September of each year and it is divided into two semesters: First semester (winter): mid-September – mid February Second semester (spring): end February – mid July <u>Public, civil and religious holidays</u> Each degree programme organizes its own calendar. Semester dates may vary from a study programme to another. For detailed information please check <u>the degree program website</u>
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Exam sessions	Students can schedule their own exam timetable within the timeframe provided by each department. <u>Registration is mandatory to take exams.</u> General calendar: 1st semester: January –February 2nd semester: June –July; September Each degree programme organizes its own calendar. Language of instruction and requirements	Language of instruction is Italian or English. Italian recommended level B1 * English recommended level B1 * Language proficiency certificates are not required for admission. * Level according to <u>Common European Framework of Reference for Languages</u> (CEFR)
Italian language courses	The University of Turin offers a 40-hour free of charge Italian language course in each semester at 3 different levels: beginner, intermediate, advanced. To obtain the related credits (5 ECTS), students need to attend at least 30 hours of classes and pass the final exam. <u>Italian language courses</u>

Academic system

Credits:

1 local credit (CFU) = 1 ECTS credit.

1 CFU corresponds to 25 hours of work including lectures, laboratories, seminars, individual studies ect. . .

Workload for incoming students is set out by sending institutions. As a general guidance, the average workload for 1-year full time studies is 60 CFU

Grading system:

The Italian grading scale runs from 0 to 30. Minimum score to pass an exam is **18**; the maximum is **30 e lode** (cum laude, “with distinction”).

University residence halls

The Regional Authority for the Right to Higher Education “Edisu Piemonte” manages a number of university halls of residence available to international students as well.

Student category	Availability of accommodation	When to book
International exchange students (non-Erasmus)	Entire exchange period	as soon as the student is accepted by Unito
Erasmus+ student for traineeship	Entire exchange period (3-4 months)	as soon as the student is accepted by Unito
Erasmus+ student for studies*	Short period (15-20 days) *	as soon as the student is accepted by Unito

*Students may be allocated a place for the entire exchange period in case of availability.

Accommodation support service

Cerco Alloggio - UniTo is an **orientation and support service** whose purpose is to help international students in their **search for accommodation** on the private market in Turin.



Registration and Orientation	First Semester: last 2 weeks of September Second Semester: last 2 weeks of February Registration and Orientation Days for incoming exchange students are arranged at the beginning of each semester. <u>Check updated information on the website.</u>

Residence Permit	Non-EU citizens planning to stay in Italy more than 90 days must apply for a residence permit for study purposes within 8 working days following their arrival in Italy. <u>Residence Permit - support service</u>
Health care and insurance	Students are responsible for their own medical insurance. <u>Health</u>
Disability	The University of Turin ensures that the necessary facilities and services are in place for students with disabilities so that you will be able to participate fully in both the academic and social life at UniTO. <u>Special needs</u>
